

# A Scout's Dedication: Carter Pitzer Builds for the Community

Son of Local 1166 Pipefitter gives back to Kokomo with new Dog Park

**Carter Pitzer**, son of 1166 KCP Pipefitter Lucas Pitzer, recently completed his Eagle Scout Project and officially achieved the rank of Eagle in the Boy Scouts of America. Eagle is the highest rank a Scout can achieve and is done so by only a small percentage of Scouts.

Along with the many merit badge requirements, service hours, leadership roles within the troop, and time/age requirements, to achieve Eagle a Scout must complete a project to benefit a local group or organization. The projects can range from fairly simple to quite complex. The Scout must create the project from start to finish. They are responsible for coming up with the idea, meeting with the beneficiary, and managing all of the labor, fundraising, and donations. The projects are meant to help the beneficiary in some way, but they also help the Scout learn many useful skills for their adult lives including, communication, project management, finance and budgeting, as well as hands on skills they acquire while performing work on their project.

Carter decided that his love for animals should play a major part in his project selection. He ultimately chose to meet with the City of Kokomo Mayor, Tyler Moore, and the head of the Parks Department, Torrey Roe. He wanted to build a dog park. Together, they chose Jackson Morrow Park for the location.

Once the location was selected, Carter went to work. He met with multiple local businesses and individuals (including our own Local 1166!) and was able to secure enough donations of material, funding, and labor to complete the nearly \$20,000 project!

The Dog Park is nearly 14,000 square feet and is the second largest in the city! Its complete with a shade structure with a concrete pad for seating, multiple benches and tables, 2 doggy waste stations and a black chain link fence.



The park is located on the East side of Jackson Morrow, near the skate park. Stop by and check it out!

## *Christmas Story*

---



### *Washington's Daring Gamble on Christmas Night, 1776*

*In the biting cold of Christmas night, 1776, General George Washington made a decision that would change the fate of America's fight for independence. The Continental Army was on the brink of collapse—morale was shattered, troops' enlistments were nearly up, and the British confidently anticipated victory within days. Washington knew he needed more than just strategy; he needed a bold, symbolic victory to reignite the revolutionary spirit.*

*Amidst snowstorms and treacherous ice floes on the Delaware River, Washington and his ragged, determined men launched one of history's most audacious assaults. As Hessian mercenaries—hired German troops allied with the British—celebrated Christmas with revelry and drinks in Trenton, New Jersey, they never imagined an attack was imminent.*

*Washington's soldiers crossed the ice-filled Delaware River under the cover of darkness, risking their lives with every stroke of the oars. Upon reaching the opposite shore, they faced a grueling nine-mile march through sleet and snow, many of them barefoot or in worn-through shoes, leaving trails of bloody footprints in the*

*snow. Exhausted but unwavering, they arrived at Trenton just as dawn broke.*

*The surprise was complete. The Hessians, caught unprepared and off guard, quickly surrendered. The Continental Army captured nearly a thousand prisoners, along with crucial supplies and ammunition. The victory at Trenton didn't just bolster morale—it breathed new life into the fledgling American Revolution and rallied support for the cause at a critical moment.*

### *A Future President's Brush with Death*

*In the midst of the battle stood 18-year-old Lieutenant James Monroe, the future fifth President of the United States. Monroe was severely wounded during the fierce fighting, taking a musket ball to the shoulder and narrowly escaping death. His bravery exemplified the grit and determination of Washington's men that pivotal morning.*

### *Did You Know?*

*To keep their mission secret, the password Washington gave his troops for the crossing was a grim but inspiring phrase: "Victory or Death." Those three words encapsulated the desperate stakes of that historic night—and the resolve that ultimately saved the Revolution.*


