Brothers and Sisters,

I want to say thanks to all the volunteers, to all who donated money, candy, and time, and also to those who brought their kids and those who attended the adult party. I was not able to attend but was receiving updates before, during, and after on the decorations, plans, and the number of over 300 kids coming to the hall. That is great!!!

As you are all aware, with Halloween over, the holiday season is now here. Life is going to get busier than it already is. Overtime and forced overtime are not going away, so plan ahead so you can spend time with your families and enjoy the holidays. Keep in mind your safety and that of your coworkers. Accident numbers seem to rise around the holidays. Be mindful of your surroundings, and let's all go home to our families safe.

The two committeemen and I were just at the UAW Stellantis Council. The reason for the council is to meet with all the UAW leaders along with all the other Stellantis UAW locals. President Fain, Director Gotinsky, all Assistant Directors, Assistant Administrators, International Reps, all but one of the IEB, and the Region Directors were all present. Reports are given on the status of the company along with future plans and product. Health and Safety is one of the longest reports given. All this information is very useful to help represent all of our members.

UAW Local 1166 was called out for the work that has gone into representing our newest brothers and sisters at the Battery Plant. But with that, we made sure that all the leaders knew that we are just scratching the surface at the battery plant and that there is a dire need to get started with negotiations on the national language and a local supplementary contract. We also had talks with AA Bell over DFM and the number of employees we have in Unit 2 to clean the whole damned casting plant and the conditions they are required to work in.

As President, I want to thank all the elected and appointed Unit 2 members for the work they do in representing the UAW DFM janitors. It is an everyday battle.

As for Unit 4 (Battery Plant), five members ran for and were elected to represent as negotiators for the members but not only that, they have taken on the responsibility, at our request, to be our eyes and ears in the battery plant until we get the language for representation and can have elections for that unit. They have served the members and this Local well. This has not been an easy task, as they get their asses kicked on a daily basis from the 400 members of that unit about health and safety, work rules, and contract negotiations. Those negotiators are **Ryan Engal, Lavon Herschberger, Greg Ault, Jeremy Miller, and Tom Brannon.**

For all the members of Local 1166:

- If there is a problem with your work duties
- If you have Health and Safety concerns or violations
- If you have contractual violations

You have a right to question and meet with your supervisors to try and solve the problems in a **REASONABLE** time frame, and if you cannot get it taken care of—you have a right to demand **UNION REPRESENTATION**—also in a reasonable time frame.

We cannot fix it if the Union does not know about it!!!!




