



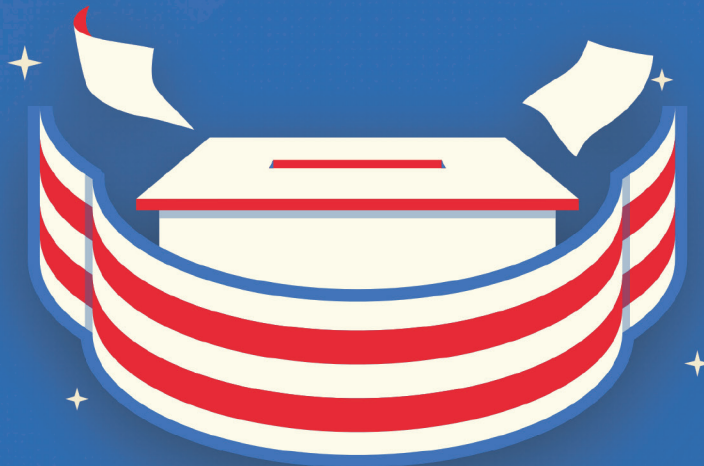

The Kokomo Rescue Mission - Community service members toured the Engagement Center

Members of the Community Service Committee recently had the opportunity to tour the Engagement Center and men's shelter at The Kokomo Rescue Mission. We saw firsthand the impact this organization is making in our community.

In the mens shelter division they are currently housing 66 men, with living arrangements based on their progress in the program. Some share larger rooms with many beds, while others stay in smaller two-person rooms with closet space as they move forward.

Beyond housing, the mission continues to expand its outreach by offering free community shower and laundry services—meeting essential needs. They are served 2 meals a day while staying there.

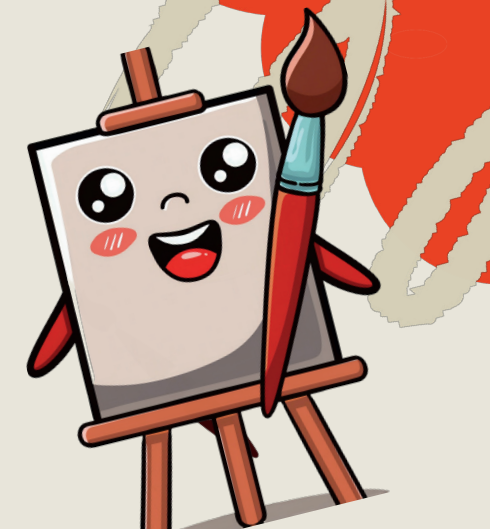

NIPSCO Locks Out 1,600 Workers

NIPSCO isn't just going to take on the Steelworkers. They're going to take on all of us.

On April 2, Northern Indiana Public Service Company locked out approximately 1,600 workers represented by United Steelworkers Locals 12775 and 13796 after contract negotiations collapsed. Workers were given no warning. They were simply asked to hand over their

company IDs, devices, and vehicle keys on their way in and told to leave.

The core issues are ones any union member will recognize: NIPSCO wants to expand the use of outside contractors, impose mandatory overtime requirements, and

limit how work is handled during outages. The USW was willing to keep working under the old contract while talks continued. NIPSCO chose the lockout instead.

The company has put a “last, best and final offer” on the table — raises of 4.25%, 4%,

and 4% over three years, with a one-time bonus of up to \$5,000 if workers ratified by April 10. That deadline came and went with no agreement reached. Talks have since stalled, and NIPSCO has stated the lockout will remain in place until the union accepts their offer.

The safety implications here are serious and affect all of us as community members. Scott McCullum, a locked-out gas serviceman, pointed out that replacement workers brought in from out of state received just one day of training for jobs that took him three years to learn. Beth McCullum, who works on large transmission gas lines at the Royal Center plant, said it plainly: “It was horrible.” These are our gas lines and our neighborhoods.

What has been inspiring is the labor community’s response. Members of UAW Locals 685 and 1166, IBEW 873, and USW 2985 from Haynes International have all joined the picket line along Boulevard Street in Kokomo. UAW Local 685 member Tina Durham said it well: “NIPSCO isn’t just going to take on the Steelworkers. They’re going to take on all of us.” UAW 1166 President Dave Willis added: “We have to stick together. We need to show support for working people.” His local pledged to stay on the line as long as the USW needs them.

Now is the time to show up in whatever way you can. Honk when you drive past the picket line. Share updates on social media to keep the pressure on. And if you’re able, go stand on that line with them. As picket captain Domonick Durham put it: “The unions are the backbone of Kokomo.” Let’s prove him right.

FCA will mail 2025 IRS Forms 1099-R and W-2 by January 31, 2026, to your address on file.

- Forms 1099-R and W-2 will be available for download in **MyPenPay** on **February 1, 2026**
- If you do not receive your tax form(s) by **February 28, 2026**, log in to Benefit Connect and click the blue **MyPenPay** link to view and print them
- If you do not have computer access, you may request a duplicate AFTER March 15, 2026, by calling **Benefit Connect** at **1-888-409-3300**

UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION AFTER MAJOR LIFE EVENTS

If you've experienced a **marriage, divorce, or the death of a spouse**, you may need to update your pension elections.

If you had a marital status change and you wish to cancel the **Surviving Spouse Option ("SSO")** and/or make a new election, follow the applicable steps below:

If your spouse has died and you previously elected the SSO, you may cancel it and have your full monthly pension restored under the single life annuity form. The cancellation takes effect on the first day of the third month after the *death certificate* is received.

You can order online, by phone, or shop in store with your flex card and any participating OTC Network retailer (Not just CVS). OTC dollars expire December 31, 2026 so use your full benefit prior. Online Account: uawtrust.org/otc_benefit or Customer Service 844-487-2770 M-F 9am – 11pm.

Your HRA Benefit increased this year to \$1000.00 per household on January 1, 2026. Debit cards are automatically reloaded so you can use your debit card for eligible expenses at a provider or pharmacy or submit for reimbursement by completing a claim form and providing documentation to WEX (claims can be submitted online or by using a paper claim form submitted using fax, email, or mail). You also can use you benefit for Medicare premium reimbursements by submitting a "Claim form". HRA Resources Online @ uawtrust.org/hra_benefit or Online account benefitslogin.wexhealth.com. Contact Customer Service 844-440-4300 M-F 7am-10PM ET. Common uses: Medicare Premiums (Part A,B, or D), Office Copays, Dental and Vision costs, Hearing Aids, Prescription Drug copays. Standard Medicare Part B monthly premium is \$202.90 this year so after May with proof of what you paid get full \$1000.00 reimbursement. *Any questions contact UAW 1166 Benefits Representative at 765-454-1761.*
