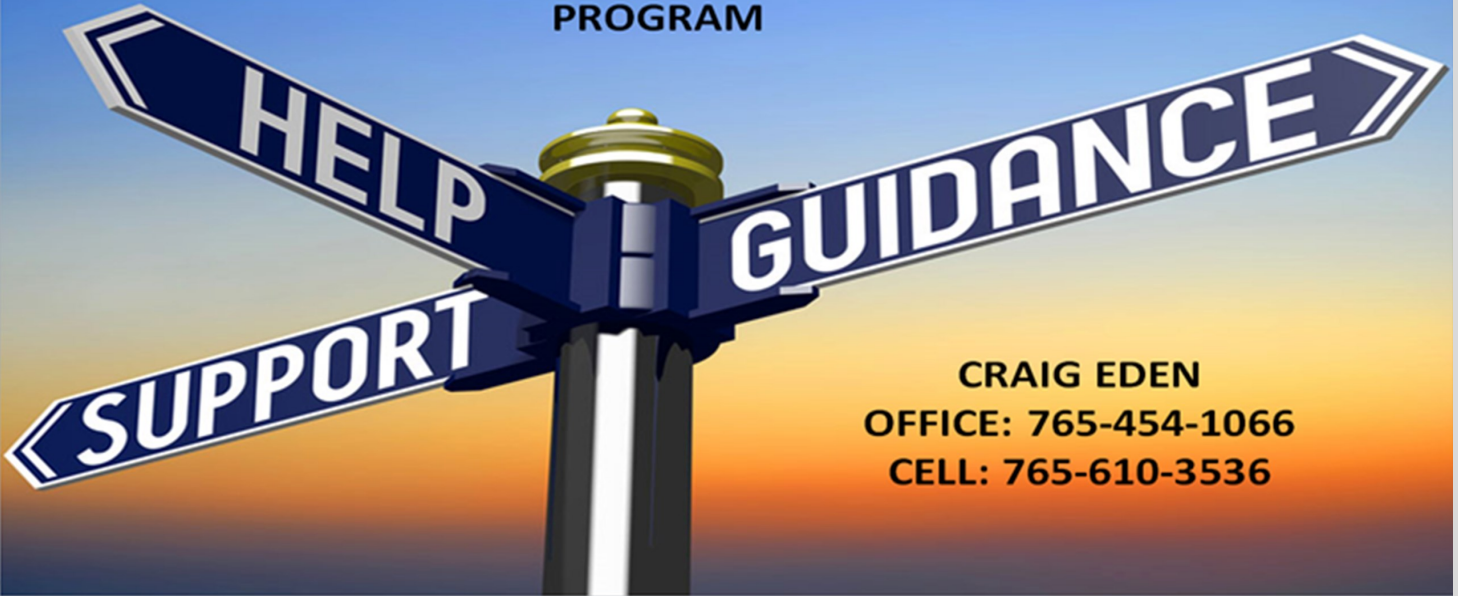



2022: EDUCATED BY THE STRIKE

Education Committee Chair: Duane Wyant

I woke up at 3am Friday to go in early for a 12hr shift and I went home that day, and as I was getting ready for bed Friday night September 12th, I received a call from our Vice President, Doug Harnish and he said show up at the hall around 10:00 pm that night just in case we strike, because at midnight, our contract officially expires. Over my 28yrs in the UAW, I have been through deadlines before, but this time I knew it was going to be different.

Let's rewind a little bit. The week prior, the trustees were given the task of preparing for a STRIKE. We went out; got firewood from Hollingsworth lumber, picked up burn barrels from Newlon metals (which those were donated to us), and get our strike signs down from the attic. I thought we were ready go, but I was only partially correct. We received a phone call between 10:45 and 11:15 to indicate that a strike was very likely. That night we received our call again and this time and it was from President Willis telling us "its go time" and we are going on strike at midnight. Immediately, we hooked up the trailer that had wood on it, got burn barrels in the back of trucks, and headed over to Buttons until the exact time of midnight when we would STRIKE. The trustees got everything unloaded at each picket site and instantly us trustees were thrown into NEW leadership roles. We went back to the hall about 1:30am that morning where we had brothers and sisters reporting for picket duty, along with others on the picket lines at the plant.

As the bargaining committee were preparing their next moves in ne-

gotiations, trustees were running the hall and it was an "OH SHIT" moment when I realized we had to be more than a trustee, we had to be a leaders because we had 1100 people depending on us to make the right decisions to send stuff out to the lines and make sure people were prepared here at the hall. We were as ready as we could be, but we didn't have everything we needed like canopies, or coolers, or snacks for the people on the line.

That first night and the next morning we were all here still prepping what we had to get done and continue this strike, as well as if continues through the weekend or longer. We had no clue how long this would last. We had other locals reaching out to us from Toledo Ohio, numerous Michigan locals, Buffalo New York, and we had brothers and sisters who drove down from Fort Wayne Gm plant to stand on the lines with us. We had region reps from all over, it was a good feeling because we had so much support and if we had questions we could ask and get answers.

That whole weekend was just nerves and adrenaline. President Willis had the right people in the right places as we needed them. We had people planning and taking notes. I want to thank Emily Summers and Joe Cook for that hard work. We had our communication team taking pictures and sending out mass texts spending long hours everywhere we needed them. I want to say thank you to Josiah Ramirez, Anthony Ervin, and our Boiler guy Dave Culp. I finally returned home on Saturday evening about 5pm and got about

6hrs of sleep then back to the grind at the hall and that was the same with all the trustees. We were there all day and night, we went home Sunday and I just got laid down that night for a few hours, then I received the call that we have a tentative agreement, so I head back to the hall with NO sleep again and prepared for the ratification vote on Monday. We had everything ready for the meeting and the vote and we successfully pulled it off, we got what we wanted and ratified the contract. I would like to say thank you to everyone who helped and made it a successful weekend helping us learn through our new experiences and leadership roles we don't normally do. We came back Tuesday and started the cleanup duties after a strike, and it took us about 4days to do so. We still had brothers and sisters helping others fill out strike vouchers for the next few days, even when the strike was over, it still wasn't done because of clean up duties. I just wanted to say thank u to all My brothers and sisters for all the new experiences that were thrown at us all year.

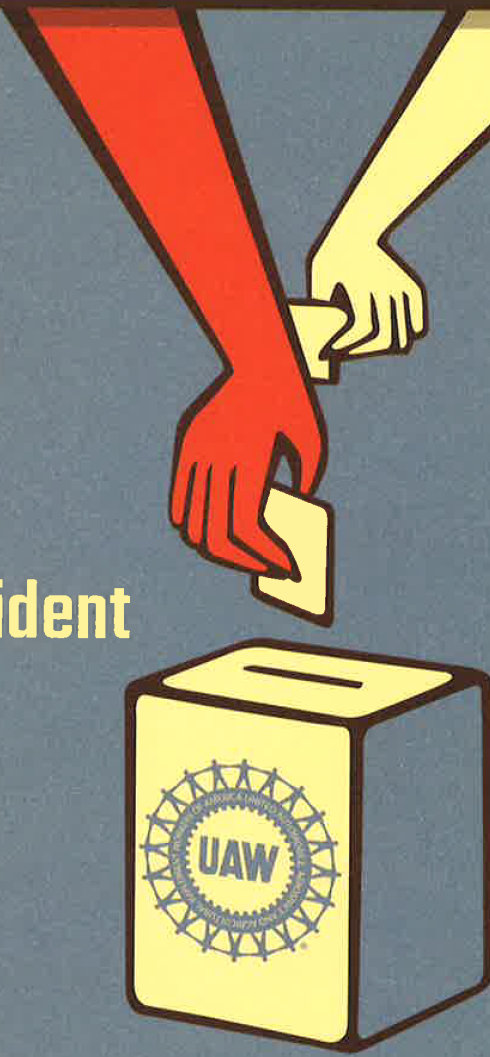

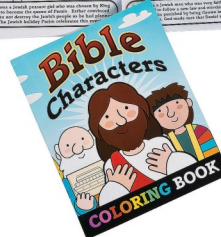

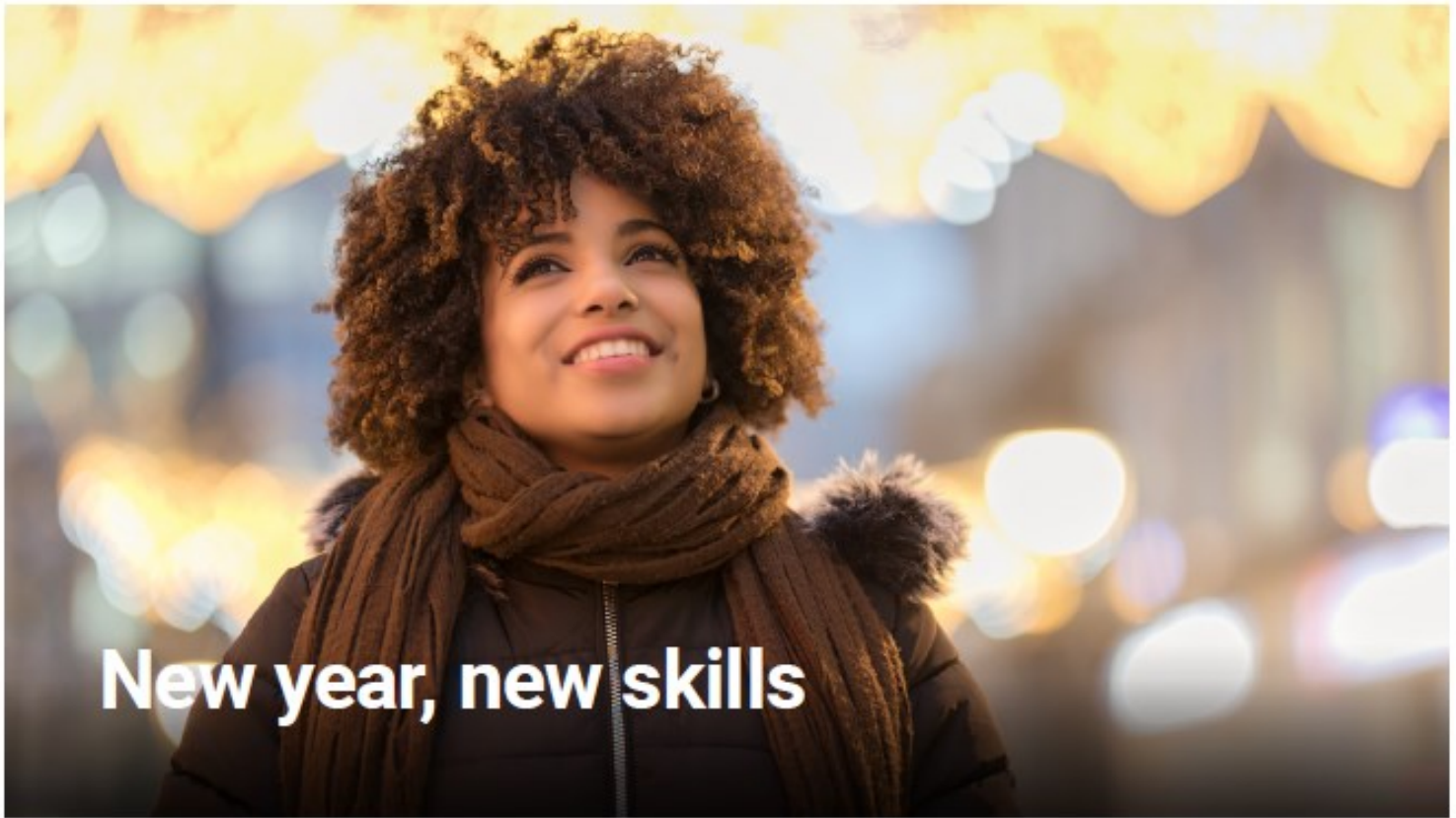
