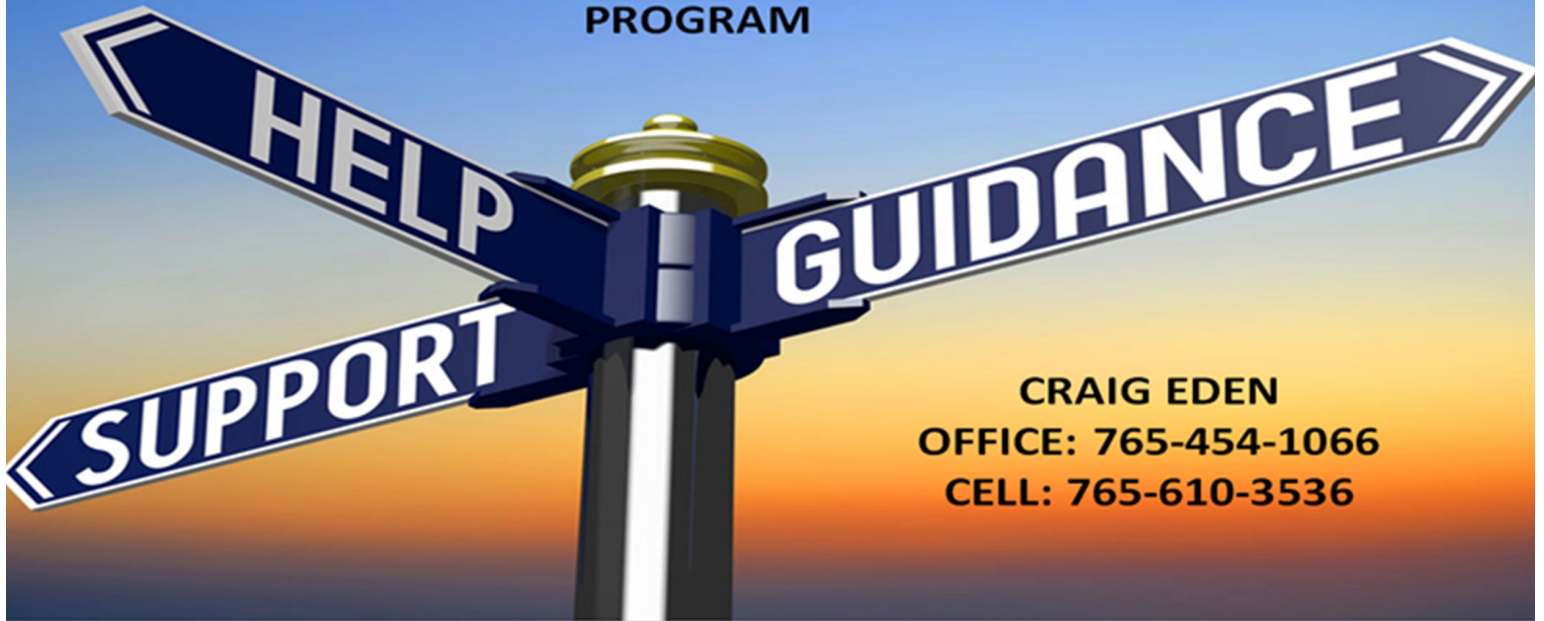

## UAW LOCAL 1166 PRESIDENT Dave Willis, Sr.

Brothers and Sisters of Local 1166,

On 9-26-2024, the committeemen and I will be in Detroit for Stellantis Council. There, we will be discussing and planning the next steps to protect our future. As you all are well aware, after ratification of the contract, the company has decided not to fulfill the commitments they agreed to at the bargaining table. In the National Agreement, the company committed \$18 billion in U.S. investments; to date, they have officially announced only \$400 million, or 2% of what they had agreed to.

They have also announced that the Belvidere investments will not happen in 2024 or 2027, along with moving the next generation Durango production outside the country to Windsor Assembly Plant. There have been, and continue to be, indefinite layoffs, temporary layoffs, plant shutdowns, and reductions of shifts at plants, including temporary layoffs here at the Casting plant.

The negotiations and commitments were bargained for in good faith by the UAW International and Stellantis, and each and every UAW member has a stake in them—job security, monetary gains, etc. To combat the contractual violations and stand up for our rights, locals have filed grievances regarding these violations of the agreement. Additionally, the International has filed an Unfair Labor Practice charge with the NLRB.

Locals are proceeding with a “Strike Authorization Vote” for violations of the National Agreement. This does not mean strikes will be called—it shows the corporation that we stand together in solidarity for Local 1166 and all our Brothers and Sisters in Stellantis Corp. and gives the International the confidence to protect and enforce the National Contract.

If Local 1166 proceeds with the “Strike Authorization Vote,” I ask that all the members stand together in solidarity and vote YES to give our authorization to protect our future.

Here are some examples of the company’s priorities:

- \$3 billion in stock buybacks.
- \$5 billion in dividends.
- A CEO pay raise of 56%.

All the while, they are starving the plants of manpower, supplies, and parts needed to keep them running effectively and efficiently.

We will keep you informed and up to date.

Again, we need to stand together in solidarity!

# HALLOWEEN FACTS

## TRICK OR TREAT

1. **SAMHAIN ROOTS:** HALLOWEEN ORIGINATED FROM THE CELTIC FESTIVAL OF SAMHAIN, MARKING THE END OF HARVEST AND BELIEVED TO BE A TIME WHEN SPIRITS RETURNED TO EARTH.
2. **CHRISTIAN INFLUENCE:** POPE GREGORY III MOVED ALL SAINTS' DAY TO NOVEMBER 1ST, MAKING OCTOBER 31ST ALL HALLOWS' EVE, WHICH LATER BECAME HALLOWEEN.
3. **JACK-O'-LANTERNS:** THE TRADITION OF CARVING PUMPKINS COMES FROM THE IRISH LEGEND OF STINGY JACK. EARLY JACK-O'-LANTERNS WERE MADE FROM TURNIPS.
4. **TRICK-OR-TREATING:** THIS TRADITION EVOLVED FROM MEDIEVAL "SOULING" AND IRISH "GUISING," WHERE PEOPLE WENT DOOR-TO-DOOR OFFERING PRAYERS OR PERFORMANCES FOR FOOD.
5. **HAUNTED HOUSES:** POPULARIZED DURING THE GREAT DEPRESSION TO PREVENT PRANKS, HAUNTED HOUSES BECAME A HALLOWEEN TRADITION FOR ENTERTAINMENT.
6. **BLACK CATS:** BLACK CATS ARE LINKED TO HALLOWEEN DUE TO MEDIEVAL BELIEFS THAT WITCHES COULD TRANSFORM INTO THEM, ASSOCIATING THEM WITH BAD LUCK.

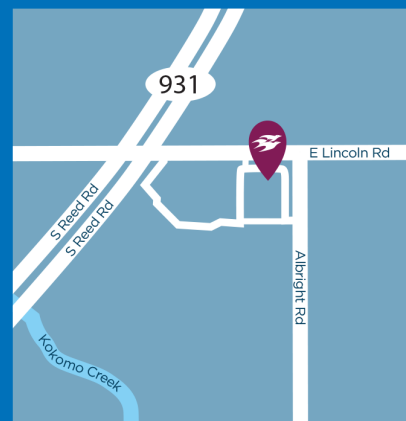

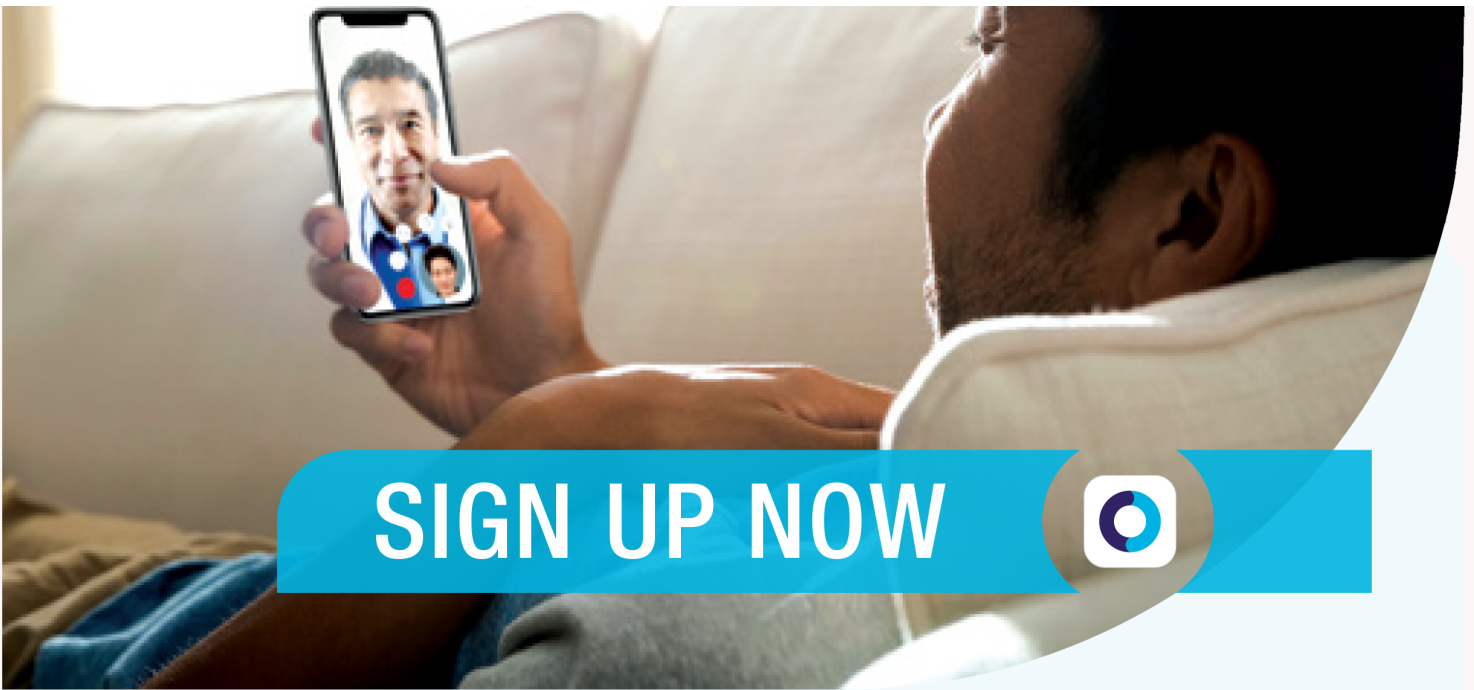
